## **FORED Projects**


(summary of 2022 and ongoing 2023)

FORED's community sustainability activity is made possible with the immeasurable contribution of our members, volunteers, directors & staff. Our hands-on, diversified volunteer Board of Directors from law, business, education, accounting, public relations, & academe, governs our policy & programs with outstanding leadership. Program highlights below:

#### **Sustainable Communities & Neighbourhoods (SCAN):**

- Community best practices in sustainability resources and <u>Landscapes magazine</u> are viewed and downloaded from our <u>website</u> routinely. With the help of advertising on Google, Facebook and Instagram, our resources are reaching <u>millions annually</u>. Our <u>special needs learning tools</u> continue to be very popular. Our new <u>Japanese</u> and <u>Korean translations</u> of educational activities were undertaken by our youth volunteers from Gastown Business College.
- We receive commending emails/comments from teachers, students.
- FORED is an advisory member of the **Institute for Environmental Learning**, led by SFU's Dr. David Zandvliet, FORED director & volunteer. This **UN-designated organization** develops and supports research on environmental learning & sustainable development across BC.
- With the help of teachers and volunteer contributions, we uploaded new educational material to the website, freely promoted by the Environmental Educators
  - <u>Provincial Specialist Association (EEPSA)</u>.
- Vancouver School Board asked FORED to participate again
  in their annual <u>Sustainability NGO Conference</u> April 24,
  2023 to showcase our youth resources. Our display
  included <u>pencils</u> with basil plant seeds inside as "swag"
  and an attention-grabbing story of a <u>taxidermized snowy</u>
  <u>owl</u>, with the appropriate permit, on loan from a
  volunteer to promote the importance of sustainability.

### Aboriginal Heritage, Education & Dialogue (AHEAD):



To celebrate cultural & heritage traditions of BC's Indigenous people, FORED offered its annual Traditional Knowledge (TK) & Medicine artwork contest for Indigenous youth. Their posters are displayed each year by the BC Ministry of Education for National Indigenous Peoples Day (June 21st) at gov't request. Prizes are awarded to winners and featured on our website.

FORED provides annual **Traditional Knowledge bursaries to** First Nations students selected by Nicola Valley Institute of Technology (NVIT). Candidates offer a short essay on how TK is applied to environmental resource management in their community. Kim McLean (left) received a \$500 FORED scholarship. She is featured in our new <u>YouTube video</u> and on <u>Facebook</u>/Instagram.

The Ministry of Advanced Education (AVED) promotes FORED's <u>YouTube</u> channel, featuring <u>Indigenous mentors</u> sharing natural resources career advice to youth, on their social media channels. The videos collectively have more than 200,000 views and 1.9M impressions (seeing video more than once). Also, the <u>UBC Library Indigenous Education K-12 Research Guide</u> for BC teachers promotes FORED's *Our Journeys*, which profiles Indigenous people who stayed in school and graduated to a variety of natural resources careers. UBC also features links to video interviews with these Indigenous leaders on our <u>YouTube</u> channel.

#### **Youth Engaging Sustainability (YES):**

FORED BC's annual youth contest for National Forest Week was expanded to include video/photography submissions from BC youths K-12. The contest theme was *Canada's Forests: Solutions for a Changing Climate*.
